Dear Friends,

It's the time of year that I remind myself Elections are a bloodletting sport. Just when you think it isn't possible for campaigns to aim any lower they prove you wrong. A recent ad the state central committee of the Minnesota Democratic-Farmer-Labor Party is distributing an ad that takes bigotry and offense to a new low. In the ad, a man dressed as a priest wears a campaign button that says "Ignore the Poor."

Now even the most virulently anti-Catholic would generally agree that the Catholic Church does a top-notch job in caring for the poor. Among our flaws and failings, ignoring the poor is not one of them. It's beyond sanity to say that the Catholic Church wants to ignore the poor. In fact our stances point out that so many of our political policies adversely hurt the poor. For instance, children born out of wedlock are more likely to live in poverty than those born to married parents. Hence our support of marriage/family life is an attempt to alleviate a cause of poverty. This ad is simply bigotry in the raw. And what's behind it? The point of the ad is to show that since the Church doesn't support every social innovation it ignores the poor or because it doesn't support abortion it just wants to keep women bare-foot and pregnant.

I've never been to Minnesota but I've been to Arizona where campaigns are not exempt from some contemptuous behaviors. In one of those campaign flyers that we receive in the mail this time of year I noticed this accusation: "Wendy Rogers has an agenda she's not telling you about. For instance: She believes women should die rather than end a pregnancy." Wow so we have Hitler in a dress running for state senator?

Then I noticed that this flyer has been paid for by the Political Committee of the Planned Parenthood Association of Arizona. No surprise there. Nor should we expect any sophisticated moral reasoning on a difficult issue from the likes of Planned Parenthood. But I guess if we flipped it around we could say, "Planned Parenthood believes an innocent baby should die rather than his mother".

This same accusation of wanting a woman to die is one that our Bishop has been labeled with after an abortion was performed at St. Joseph's Hospital in Phoenix under the justification of saving the life of the mother. He's been accused of not caring about the life of the mother. It's shameless when such a difficult issue is reduced to scurrilous labeling. The principle that Candidate Rogers is upholding is the same as Bishop Olmsted's position, namely that in cases of difficult pregnancies there are two patients: the mother and the child. Medical procedures should try to save both lives. And a medical procedure should never directly intend ending the life of either.

A medical case where the life of the mother and/or child is in jeopardy is never an easy situation. And requires solid moral analysis to be applied to the medical procedures not facile mean-spirited accusations about wanting a woman to die.

As we approach another election many of the votes we cast require some judicious and prudential decision-making. On our website, at the bottom left is a link entitled "Faithful Citizenship" which connects you to the Arizona Catholic Conference Voter Guide. The Voter Guide submits questions to candidates on various issues of importance and reports their response, if any. It is meant as a way to inform our decision making process so we can consider the information in deciding on how and for whom we cast our ballots. Read, pray, vote.

PS On Nov. 3rd, the US Supreme Court will hear oral arguments in the case *Garriott v Winn*. At issue is whether or not the Arizona Tuition Tax Credit Program (in which the CTODP participates) that advances the legislature's legitimate secular purpose of expanding educational options for families unconstitutionally endorses or advances religion simply because taxpayers choose to direct more contributions to religious organizations than nonreligious ones. Our position is that it is constitutional. Let's hope the Supremes agree. This is us folks and the ruling could deny parents the ability to choose which school is best for their child. Keep this in prayer.

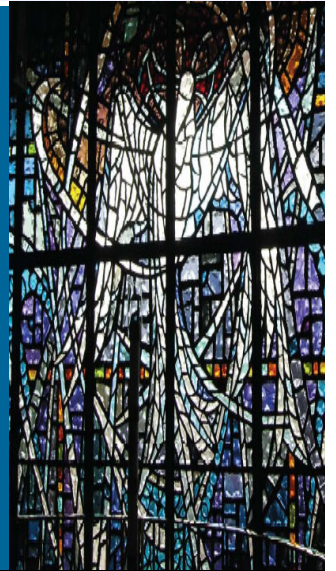
