Dear Friends,

There are times, I admit when I feel like the butcher, the baker and the candlestick maker, chief cook and bottle washer, coach, quarterback and receiver, landlord and tenant, comforter and afflicter, and well you get the point. Somewhere along the way we've taken St. Paul's admonishment "to be all things to all men" in the wrong direction! While it does amaze me that without any formal training I've learned the inane intricacies of things like accrual accounting, banal and byzantine IRS regulations for non-profits, that being a dual-status taxpayer is not a honorific title. I also learned health, safety and fire codes for various counties that I have been assigned in and learned how to prevent lice in schools. That little boys have a "let's flush everything down the toilet" phase and that plumbers are more important than surgeons. I have learned what a BTU and EER mean and become more familiar than I ever wanted to be with the Registrar of Contractors and the AZ Corporation Commission. I have also learned that people who design hospitals have never been sick nor lost, that the "fine" print isn't so fine, and that the one thing that could cause me to violate the 5th Commandment is, well copier machines... I could go on, but now it's your turn to do some unexpected things that push you beyond your comfort zone.

One of the biggest obstacles to service in the Church is the anxiety, that you are not good enough, worthy enough or competent enough to do it. While all that may be so the greater reality is that, again from St. Paul: "I can do all things through Him who strengthens me". Now there are dozens of ministries here at Mt. Carmel that can use your service. They are listed on our website and most of them will be on display at the People Raiser this weekend. But if one of them is not where you feel called or comfortable or you just don't know which to choose, here are some other ways you could serve that still make a difference:

Sunday Night Dinners: cook a meal now and then, or serve or help with clean up

Childcare Volunteer: take one Sunday a month to volunteer in the morning during Mass

Daily Mass: be a reader one day a week at Mass

Coffee Shop: Baristas needed

Our **School** could always use your talents: be a tutor, a library assistant, a coach or and assistant coach, speak to the classes about your expertise, office help, answer phones and many other areas are also in need of volunteers.

Or maybe you can **read the fine print:** contract reviewers are deeply appreciated!

Clerical help: Can you file, shred, type, help at the front desk or answer phones?

Maintenance: Can you paint? Good at electrical work, cleaning, plumbing, AC knowledge, and window washing?

Gardening: help us grow things that are pretty!

For some, all of these are not presently possible because of other obligations such as being a full time caregiver or facing some health issues. In that case you can still participate in service to the Parish! No one gets off the hook! First and foremost we need pray-ers: people who will intercede for those who are engaged in service.

If none of this works for you then you can be a part of the 'box ministry'. We have three boxes on the grounds that can use your support. First the green paper recycle bin in the parking lot (which does generate some income). You can easily make it a weekly task to gather up paper not only from your home but maybe your neighbor's or a family member's and drop it off in the box. The second box, also in the parking lot is for clothing and shoes that Catholic Charities uses to support My Sister's Place, a home for abused women. Finally there are the St. Vincent de Paul boxes in the Church, which you can put on your supermarket list each week.

Whatever the case may be you can use your talents, gifts, treasures, experience, strengthens and hopes to serve the Body of Christ. Stewardship is the call of the Christian. There are minor ways to serve and major ways to serve. Whether you are in the majors or minors its time to step up to the plate! Whom do you serve?

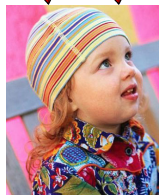
Everything I have is yours.” - Luke 15:31
